

Catholic Corner – September 22 Feast Days

On September 22, the Church honors two inspiring groups of saints:

St. Thomas of Villanova and
St. Maurice with his Companions.


St. Thomas of Villanova was a 16th-century Augustinian friar and later Archbishop of Valencia, Spain. He became known as the “Father of the Poor” for his extraordinary generosity. Instead of living in comfort, he gave away much of his own income to hospitals, the needy, and those who came to him in need. Families can celebrate his feast day by practicing acts of charity—perhaps donating to a food pantry, offering clothing to a shelter, or performing a small kindness for someone in need.

St. Maurice and his Companions were Roman soldiers of the Theban Legion, made up of Christians from Egypt. In the year 287, they were ordered by the Emperor Maximian to take part in pagan sacrifices. Courageously, they refused and were martyred for their faith. Their witness reminds us of the strength and bravery it takes to remain faithful, even when it is difficult. Families can honor their memory by praying together for Christians around the world who still face persecution today.

These feast days remind us that charity and courage are timeless virtues we are all called to live out in our daily lives.

Family Activities

- For St. Thomas of Villanova: As a family, gather a small bag of canned goods or gently used clothing and take it to a local food pantry or donation center. Even young children can help pick out an item to give, showing that everyone has something to share.
- For St. Maurice and Companions: Set aside time as a family to pray for Christians who face persecution today. You could light a candle together and say a decade of the Rosary, or simply offer a prayer for those who are suffering for their faith.
