DRESS CODE REMINDERS

Shoes: Students should wear appropriate shoes for daily school activities. **Tennis shoes are required when attending P.E.** Heel height should be appropriate to the child's age for safety reasons. **No backless, "mule" or "flip flop" style shoes or sandals without a heel strap for safety reasons.**

Your Missouri income taxes can help a child access Catholic education. The state of Missouri allows any business or individual to direct up to half of state income tax liability to education. The Bright Futures Fund, a 501c3 of the diocese, provides Catholic school scholarships to students funded solely with taxes you are required to pay anyway.

Why leave your tax dollars on the table when you can direct half to help a child access a quality Catholic education? Help provide over \$12 million in scholarships this year at no extra cost to you. By re-directing taxes, we can practice good stewardship and actively support a brighter future for students.

How to reserve MOScholars tax credits that provide scholarships:

1. Review your 2024 W-2 (boxes 16 & 17) to estimate your 2025 state income tax liability.
2. Visit BrightFuturesFund.org and click "Reserve Your MO Tax Credits Here" (a link to the MO state treasurer's website). Select "Bright Futures Fund" as your Educational Assistance Organization (EAO) and reserve up to 50% of your estimated liability.
3. You'll receive email confirmation from the state. Mail your check for the reserved amount to Bright Futures Fund, P.O. Box 419037, Kansas City, MO 64141, within 30 days & before Dec. 31, 2025.
4. When filing your 2025 taxes in 2026, use the state's email confirmation to claim your 100% tax credit on the MO-TC form. You can also carry forward any unused credits for up to four years.




